## Tom O'Toole shares secrets

INSPIRATIONAL businessman Tom O'Toole, shared his story of business success to boost the morale of local business owners on Thursday night.

The baker from Beechworth in Victoria started out with a small business in what was a dying town, and now boasts six bakeries and turns over more than \$12 million a year.

About 100 people attended the Airlie After Hours function at the Reef Gateway Hotel from a range of industries including tourism and real estate.

Mr O'Toole's comical conversations were filled with strong, yet simple messages on how to be successful in busi-

"I'm no big dog business guru," he said.

"I'm a kindergarten drop out. When I started to write down my goals and date them it changed my life.

The sentiment from a number of Whitsunday business people last week was that the series of natural disasters in Queensland has meant businesses in the Whitsundays have suffered.

But Mr O'Toole said now was the time for business owners to shine.

"Don't wait for the storm to pass," he

Mr O'Toole said his struggling town of Beechworth once had 10 days without anyone in the main street.

He said working together was what got their town back up and running.
